**District hopes new middle school in Spanish Springs will help alleviate overcrowding**

On Dec. 14, Washoe County School District officials gathered at the site of where the new Sky Ranch Middle School will be in Spanish Springs to mark the beginning of construction. Located near the developing Kiley Ranch neighborhood on David Allen Parkway, the new school is expected to hold at least 1,400 students in grades 6-8 and open by the 2019-20 school year.

Last summer the WCSD voted to purchase 30 acres of land from developers of Kiley Ranch North, closing escrow soon after in August 2016. Most of the acreage will be used for the Sky Ranch Middle School (18-20 acres) and the rest for a potential elementary school that may be built down the line. Sky Ranch was named after an airfield that was used during World War II as a training ground for the army and then to host the National Championship Air Races in the mid-1960s.

The new school is likely to help relieve overcrowding in existing schools and other local elementary schools while also meeting the district's longtime goal of moving sixth grade students from an elementary level up into the middle schools. This will allow the district to take elementary schools off of the multi-track calendar, move away from team teaching, and generally improve the environment for all students and staff. New middle schools are also being built in South Reno and Sun Valley.

"The new zoning will be a public process that hasn't been brought to the WCSD board yet, but between this new school and Sun Valley it could affect upwards of 15,000 students that could see overcrowding relief," says WCSD Spokesman for Capital Projects Riley Sutton. Sutton explains that adjusting the sixth grade class relieves full classes

and rooms currently being used.








"It creates a domino effect all the way to Verdi with what these two schools allow us to do and then we can rebalance after that," Sutton says. "We get a lot of bang for our buck."

The cost of building the new school is not expected to exceed \$85 million and is funded primarily through the Washoe County School District tax that

voters passed in 2016 to raise money for the district's capital improvement projects.

"(This middle school being built) is a direct result of that funding," Sutton says, along with various property taxes and bonds that can be pulled out of the district's general fund. "This is 100 percent WC-1 enabled in all our capital funding."

### VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS HELPING RESCUED POMERIANIANS FIND HOMES

LAS VEGAS — The Vegas Golden Knights are teaming up with the Animal Foundation to find homes for recently rescued Pomeranians.

Las Vegas authorities rescued 164 Pomeranians crammed in a rental truck without food, water or ventilation in late November.

Fifteen of the dogs will be up for adoption during a Monday event at City National Arena.

There will be a live auction for five of the dogs following the Golden Knights' practice.

Adult attendees will get a free chance to adopt one of the 10 remaining dogs and can purchase additional \$20 tickets to increase their chances of winning the drawing.

Winners will be chosen at random.

An online promotion to facilitate adoptions for the remaining 149 dogs will also launch at the event.

### BOY DIES AFTER BEING FOUND IN HOT TUB AT LAKE TAHOE RESORT

STATELINE — Authorities say a 4-year-old boy is dead after he was found in a hot tub at a Lake Tahoe resort in what appears to be an accident.

Police say the boy from Redwood City, California, was found Sunday afternoon at Montbleu Resort Casino and Spa in Stateline, Nevada.

The Douglas County Sheriff's Office says the child was taken to Barton Memorial Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

His name was not immediately released.

### SUSPECT ACCUSED OF POINTING GUN AT RENO FIREFIGHTERS

RENO — Authorities say Reno firefighters investigating a possible gas leak came face to face with a gun.

Reno police say firefighters were called Saturday shortly before noon about a gas leak coming from inside an apartment.

Upon approach, 48-year-old Michael Whiteford opened the door and pointed a firearm at two of the firefighters.

Police say Whiteford then immediately shut the door.

Firefighters immediately called police.

Police say officers were able to get Whiteford out of the apartment and arrested him.

He showed signs of being intoxicated.

They say it was not clear why he pointed the gun at the firefighters.

Utility workers confirmed there was a small gas leak and repaired it.

### NEVADA GOVERNOR AND WIFE SEPARATING, PLAN TO DIVORCE

CARSON CITY — Nevada Gov. Brian Sandoval says he and his wife, Kathleen, have decided to separate and plan to divorce after 27 years of marriage.

The two-term Republican said in a statement released Friday that "demands of public life are hard on a marriage and ours has been affected in a way neither of us had envisioned or expected."

The statement says the Sandovals remain committed to their three children and ask that their family's privacy be respected "during this difficult time."

The Sandovals were married in

1990. They have two adult children and a teenager.

A Reno native, Brian Sandoval was first elected governor in 2010 and re-elected in 2014. He served in the Nevada Assembly, as state attorney general and as a federal judge before becoming governor.

### 2 KILLED IN EARLY MORNING APARTMENT FIRE IN RENO

RENO — Two people have been killed in an early morning fire at an apartment building on the west side of Reno.

The Reno Fire Department confirmed two civilian fatalities Thursday in the fire that broke out about 1:45 a.m. at the Stardust Apartments.

Fire officials say they successfully evacuated nine apartment units but that two occupants became trapped inside and crews were unable to rescue them. One pet also died.

No names have been released.

The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

### HIGHER ENTRY FEES ANNOUNCED FOR GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK

BAKER — Federal officials are raising fees for cave tours and campground stays within Nevada's vast Great Basin National Park.

New fees that take effect Jan. 1 will raise the cost of all Lehman Caves tours by \$1.

That means 60-minute tours for adults will be \$9, and 90-minute tours will cost \$11.

Youth rates will be \$5 and \$6.

Camping at Wheeler Peak, Upper Lehman Creek, Lower Lehman Creek, Baker Creek and Grey Cliffs

will increase \$3 per night, to \$15.

Grey Cliffs group campsite fees will increase \$5, to \$30.

Senior and access pass discounts still apply.

Acting park Superintendent Curt Dimmick calls the increases modest, and says the money they raise will underwrite services at the park where visitation increased 25 percent in 2016, to nearly 145,000 people.

### NEVADA ALLOCATES \$4 MILLION MORE TO RAPE KIT BACKLOG TESTING

CARSON CITY — Nevada is awarding \$2.7 million to Las Vegas police to continue to pay for testing a backlog of thousands of sexual assault evidence kits, including some that went untested for up to 30 years.

State Board of Examiners approval on Tuesday to award the money to Clark County followed a similar grant in October of \$1.6 million for the Washoe County sheriff's office kit testing program.

State Attorney General Adam Laxalt announced that his office is directing into the program an additional \$1.3 million in settlement funds not derived from taxpayer money.

Rape or sexual assault kits contain biological specimens from people who report they were sexually assaulted. Many languished for years in police evidence vaults instead of at testing labs, while cases remained unsolved.

Authorities say more than 5,800 untested evidence kits have been assigned for testing in Nevada, of about 7,500 identified in 2016.

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# Wreaths Across America honors veterans during the holiday season

Christmas is a time for family and friends to get together and not only celebrate the people in our lives but also recognize the inherent freedoms that we enjoy thanks to those who've risked their lives to give us a better future.

Which is partly the reason why 20-year veteran Morrill Worcester founded Wreaths Across America. There is a lot of symbolism in a WAA wreath, each made with care and support for our nation's fallen heroes. In the "What is a Veteran Wreath?" video, Worcester explains that each wreath is made up of 10 balsam bouquets each meant to describe a veteran.

Each of the bouquets in a wreath represents a veteran's: faith in God; love for one another; strength, work ethic and character; honesty and integrity; humility, selflessness and modesty; ambitions and aspirations; optimism for fellow Americans; concern for the future and future generations; pride in carrying out their duties; and the hopes and dreams that didn't always come true

but left them with no regrets.

The wreath becomes a symbol of honor, respect, and victory. It is made from evergreens which symbolizes longevity and endurance along with its plain forest smell to give a sense of purity and simplicity. The wreath's circular shape symbolizes eternity with no beginning and no end while its red bow portrays a veteran's great sacrifice.

"Placing a wreath is your personal gift to an American hero," Worcester says in the video.

Adopted at the Northern Nevada Veterans Memorial Cemetery in 2007 by a group of volunteers placing 28 wreaths, the National Wreaths Across America Day has grown to honor more than 7,500 veterans. As a whole, the WAA recognizes fallen veterans in 1,200 locations across all 50 states. Volunteers and loved ones gather at veterans' cemeteries everywhere for one set day in December to place their wreaths.

For the event held at Fernley's NNVMC, people placed 2,400 wreaths on grave sites and 5,500 more that came in on a later shipment.

"Wreaths Across America fundraises throughout the year and then takes the donations to obtain live wreaths which are in turn distributed to at least 750 veterans' ceremonies throughout the country," says Nevada Department of Veteran Services Communications Director Terri Hendry about the Wreaths Across America event organized in Fernley on Dec. 16.

"The Nevada Veterans Coalition spearheaded all of this—they provide the volunteers and the turnout to provide a wreath for every veteran's gravesite," she adds. Even though it was a bit chilly in Fernley last Saturday, it didn't stop the 1,500-2,000 people from coming out.

"It's pretty amazing, we had a lot of kids out there and we expect a lot more to come out today (on Dec. 18).

It's wonderful to have such a supportive community that recognizes our active military and veterans. It was freezing cold but people came out because they understand that the military deserves this and it's important that we remember them," Hendry adds.

## Lifeguard training class to be held over winter break at community center

Become a certified lifeguard through the Sparks Parks and Recreation Department's American Red Cross Lifeguard Training program. A Winter Break session will be held January 2 through 6 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Alf Sorensen Community Center, 1400 Baring Blvd. The cost is \$90 (\$75 for residents of Sparks).

Lifeguard training candidates must be 15 years or older and pass a swim performance test prior to acceptance into the class, which includes the following prerequisites:

- Brick recovery from deep water.
- Swim 300 yards using Freestyle, Breaststroke or a combination of both.
- Tread water with legs only for 2 minutes.

Students who complete the course will receive an American Red Cross Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED certificate valid for two years.

The registration fee for the training includes instruction, course materials, and an administration fee. Financial assistance is available for youth who cannot otherwise participate in the program due to financial limitations. 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# Nevada Democrat, facing ethics probe, won't seek re-election

LAS VEGAS — First-term Democratic Congressman Ruben Kihuen of Nevada, who is at the center of sexual harassment allegations, announced Saturday he won't seek re-election.

Kihuen's announcement came a day after the House Ethics Committee opened an investigation into whether Kihuen "may have engaged in sexual harassment" with a campaign aide and a lobbyist.

"I want to state clearly again that I deny the allegations in question," Kihuen said. "I am committed to fully cooperating with the House Ethics Committee and I look forward to clearing my name."

The freshman congressman said the accusations

would be distraction during a re-election campaign.

"Therefore, it is in the best interests of my family and my constituents to complete my term in Congress and not seek re-election," Kihuen said.

A former campaign aide said Kihuen propositioned her for dates and sex despite her repeated rejections during his 2016 campaign. A lobbyist told the Nevada Independent that he touched her thighs and buttocks and made unwanted sexual advances while he was a state senator.

The Ethics Committee Friday by the panel's Republican chairwoman and its ranking Democrat said the fact the committee was investigating the allegations does not indicate any violation has occurred and that the committee would make no further public statements pending completion of its initial review.

Kihuen's decision may not be enough for some of his colleagues. The top House Democrat, Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, has called on Kihuen to resign, a request that he has resisted. Kihuen also apologized after the first allegation was made public, but said he didn't remember the events the way the

former campaign aide had described.

A native of Mexico and the first Latino to represent Nevada in Congress, Kihuen represents the state's 4th Congressional District, which stretches north from the Las Vegas metro area into sparsely populated central Nevada.

Kihuen is among a growing number of lawmakers whose political careers have been thrust into uncertainty or ended altogether by allegations of sexual misconduct. On Thursday, Rep. Blake Farenthold, R-Texas, said he would not seek re-election amid sexual harassment allegations that he has denied.

Rep. Trent Franks, R-Ariz., abruptly resigned last week over revelations that he'd asked two staff members to act as surrogates to have his child, offering one \$5 million.

Also, Rep. John Conyers, D-Mich., retired weeks after former aides shared stories of habitual sexual harassment. Sen. Al Franken, D-Minn., announced he would step down after he was accused of improper behavior by at least eight women and his support from fellow Democrats collapsed.

## Study: Loss of water in drought caused Sierra Nevada to rise

Loss of water from rocks during drought caused California's Sierra Nevada to rise nearly an inch (2.5 centimeters) in height from October 2011 to October 2015, according to a new NASA study made public Wednesday.

The study also found that in the following two years of increased snow and rain, the rocks in the range regained

about half as much water as was lost during the drought and the return of the weight caused the height of the mountains to fall about half an inch (1.3 centimeters).

"This suggests that the solid Earth has a greater capacity to store water than previously thought," study leader Donald Argus of NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California,

# Pack gets back on track with 77-62 win over Radford

RENO — Jordan Caroline scored 25 points and hauled in 15 rebounds to lead Nevada to a 77-62 win over Radford on Sunday.

Kendall Stephens added 19 points and Josh Hall had 11 as Nevada shot 43 percent from the field, getting 21 assists on its 26 buckets, to extend its home win streak to 10 stretching to last season. The win also ended a two-game skid, both on the road, for the Wolf Pack.

Nevada (9-2) broke away with a 15-3 run over the final four minutes of the opening half to take a 40-24 advantage into the break. Stephens and Hallice Cooke each had 3-pointers in the run.

In the second half, Radford (5-5) closed the gap to 50-46 on Devonnte Holland's jumper with 11:10 to play but it was as close the Highlanders got as Nevada broke away again with an 11-4 burst sparked with a 3-point play from Caroline, who finished with his fifth double-double of the season.

Carlik Jones got 12 points for Radford and Randy Phillips had 11.

## Salt Lake City aiming for bid for 2030 Winter Olympics

SALT LAKE CITY — Utah officials studying the possibility of Salt Lake City making a bid to host another Winter Olympics said Monday they would rather host the games in 2030, but could be ready if they're needed for 2026.

Hosting the games after the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles would provide a better opportunity to raise sponsorship dollars, said Fraser Bul-

lock, co-chairman of the committee and a key player in the city's 2002 Olympics. Los Angeles has exclusive rights to negotiate first with potential sponsors to help fund their games, meaning hosting the games before them would be more complicated than after, Bullock said.

"But if nobody else bids for 2026, we would certainly be available," Bullock said.

Denver and Reno, Nevada have also expressed interest in the U.S. Internationally,

cities considering making a bid include Sion, Switzerland; Calgary, Canada; and Sapporo, Japan.

The Salt Lake City committee held its second meeting Monday, discussing in broad strokes budget, venues, staffing, transportation and environmental issues.

The group is leaning toward recommending that the city make another bid but will issue its full report to state leaders on Feb. 1. It will include a budget estimate and other detailed plans.

Princess Cassandra of Troy was reincarnated a few thousand years later in Canada in the form of a grandmotherly urban futurist.

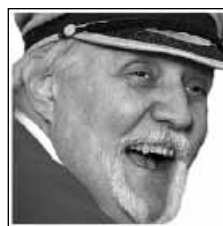
Irving Berlin once said that the world was fortunate that his music's greatest performer, Ethyl Merman, had no vocal training. The same may be said about Jane Jacobs (1916-2006) who had no formal education in city planning, yet changed the way we look at the world. And how we live today.

She is best known for her still-influential 1961 book "The Death and Life of Great American Cities."

She detested suburbs which she called "ghastly communities" and recognized the obvious: Humans are social critters. Most people like to live near other people where they work and interact. Skyrocketing real estate prices are a testament to that obvious observation.

"Lack of variety in age and overhead is an unavoidable defect in large new shopping centers," she wrote, adding "even the most successful cannot incubate the unusual -- a point overlooked by planners of downtown shopping center projects."

Sparks and Reno's grandiose downtown redevelopment schemes over the past half-century have crashed and burned, torching hundreds of millions for such follies. You could shoot a cannon thru Victorian Square just about anytime and not hit anybody. Downtown Reno is a symphony of shuttered storefronts which city hall now treats with cosmetics. Changing the Reno Arch from warm, welcoming colors to icy blue will solve all problems, right?

Sparks lives on the edge of insolvency after subsidizing the Scheels/Marina corporate welfare project, blithely and blindly creating a competitor to its downtown corporate welfare debacle. The latter has been largely bulldozed for apartments, perhaps not a bad idea although city hall changed the rules in 2015 to import cheap labor.

Jacobs might approve of people being able to live within walking distance of their work.

Reno subsidized the Union Pacific train trench which has technically bankrupted the city. Goldman Sachs and Deutsche Bank can foreclose anytime they like and force court-imposed tax increases to pay the millions owed.

While Reno City Hall was partying away the future, the economy recovered and it turned out that not everybody had gone broke.

Largely without fanfare, small businesses sprang up in the oldest parts of downtown, followed by apartment construction -- Jane Jacobs-style activity while city hall talked about abandoning streets for a pedestrian mall.

"There is no magic in simply removing cars from downtown," Jacobs wrote, adding "the whole point is to make the streets more surprising, more compact, more variegated and busier than before -- not less so."

Jacobs could not save New York City's Penn Station but stopped Robert Moses from destroying Green-

wich Village for a freeway. She was not optimistic for the United States.

In her 1984 book "Cities and the Wealth of Nations," she argued against both guns and butter. Military and domestic spending are always in conflict in any empire. Both lead to decline, Jacobs asserted.

The only solution she envisioned has begun to happen: Big countries breaking up into smaller ones. In 1984, she noted the success of Singapore and Norway. We've since seen the likes of the Czech Republic come into being and do very well. Yugoslavia had a chance, so did Iraq, both suffocated by religion-based war.

An independent Kurdistan and Catalonia might light the path to the future. But what about us?

After reading Jacobs and Joel Garreau's "The Nine Nations of North America" during the early stages of Reaganomics, I posited that states and regions would band together in common interest if the central government became increasingly responsive only to the whims of the wealthy.

And so here we are this week with a huge new Reaganesque giveaway to our untitled aristocracy.

The de facto dissolution of the formerly United States continues. Can Humpty Dumpty be put back together again?

Agitate. Organize!

Be well. Raise hell. *Esté bien. Haga infierno.*

## Bundy case secrecy being rightfully challenged

No matter how the current trial of four defendants in the April 2014 standoff between armed protesters and Bureau of Land Management agents trying to confiscate Cliven Bundy's cattle turns out -- conviction, acquittal, mistrial, dismissal of charges -- the case will stand as an historic example of how sweeping secrecy can cast doubt on whether justice is being served.

This past week U.S. District Judge Gloria Navarro halted testimony in the current trial and sent the jurors home while she heard arguments behind closed doors over whether the prosecution had failed to provide the defense with potentially excul-

patory evidence quickly enough. The judge said the prosecution's repeated failure to timely disclose information was "sufficient to undermine the confidence in the outcome of the trial," which she said could result in a mistrial.

Attorney Maggie McLetchie -- representing the Las Vegas Review-Journal newspaper and Battle Born Media, which publishes weekly newspapers in Mesquite, Ely,

Eureka, Sparks and Lincoln and Mineral counties -- promptly filed a motion seeking to intervene, which was granted. The newspapers are asking that all documents previously filed under seal be unsealed and that future hearings be conducted in open court.

In July 2016, despite objections from the newspapers, the judge granted the government's request for a protective order that required nearly every piece of paper to be filed under seal due to some vague suspicions that witnesses and law enforcement officers might be subjected to threats, intimidation or

# World's Strongest Man

The time was April of 1957, some sixty years ago, when Reno was to receive its most spectacular appearance on television.

The occasion was to occur in the Sky Room of the Mapes Hotel when strong man Paul Anderson would make a three or four minute live appearance on the famous Ed Sullivan Show. As reported in the Press, the popular Sullivan Show had an audience of 40,000,000 viewers.

The back story to this event is an interesting one and it began when owner Charles Mapes invited me to accompany him to meet the aforementioned Anderson in LA. He explained on the way down that Anderson had won Olympic Gold in the heavyweight division of lifting in the 1956 Olympics.

I queried Mapes as to what such an individual could do to entertain show patrons. He replied that we could figure out a number of spectacular "lifts" that no one else could duplicate. I wondered to myself whether or not dinner show patrons would be interested in watching a herculean strong man sweat as they were dining on the Mapes fine cuisine.

When we arrived we were met by one Pierre Cosette, who was the talent booking agent for the Mapes. As we drove away from the airport, Mapes commented on the age of Cosette's car. Cosette replied, "Well, at least it's a Mercedes Benz!"

We motored to a very modest house in Watts and entered to meet Anderson and his manager. In person the Olympic weight lifter was a shade under six feet and weighed some three hundred pounds. His manager was a rather gruff individual who reminded me of a carny barker.

Our group went to the heavily-weeded back yard where Anderson proposed to show us his amazing ability. In one corner of the yard was a rusty set of railroad wheels attached to a train axle. With almost consummate ease, Anderson did a number of lifts with the heavy object. It was enough of a show to have Mapes immediately book him.

Returning to Reno, the next task was to figure out the best way to present Anderson to a nightclub audience. It was decided that well-known comic Dave Barry would act as emcee and string the whole production together. In addition to Anderson and Barry, the show would feature the chorus line-The Mapes Skyettes, dancer Sonny Howe, singer Joe Kirchen and the orchestra of Eddie Fitzpatrick.

At a meeting in Mapes office, I asked him (Mapes) what he thought the maximum weight was that Anderson could lift. Mapes replied, "Somewhere around nine hundred pounds". I mentioned to Mapes that I knew a bag of one thousand silver dollars weighed sixty pounds and that possibly we could get enough bags of the coins to total nine hundred pounds. It would represent a \$15,000 "lift" that we could offer to the person that could match Anderson's lifting. Mapes was intrigued by the idea

and we subsequently had Tripp Plastics assemble two large plastic boxes, one on each end of a long bar. This instrument was placed in the lobby of the hotel during the daytime hours with a sign attached touting the "Mapes \$15,000 Challenge".

For the twice-a-night show it would take four men to muscle the silvery barbell up to the Sky Room. At each performance, we would make sure that we had a couple of muscular gentlemen as "plants" in the audience, who would come on stage and attempt to lift a 300-lb. standard barbell in order to qualify to attempt the heavier lift. Needless to say, none of them was ever successful.

Towards the end of Anderson's two-week engagement, Mapes called me in and said he had good news for me. When I asked what that would be, he replied, "The Anderson Show has been so popular, I've decided to book him for another two weeks." This did not come as very exciting news to me since I had sweated almost as much as Anderson to fill his thirty shows in the initial two weeks.

During this conversation, Cosette happened to be in the office with us and when Mapes asked me what we could do to increase interest in Anderson's continuing performance, I suggested that the host of the most popular show on television was Ed Sullivan. Since he (Sullivan) had been a sports writer prior to his TV career, perhaps we could get Anderson a live spot on his New York show. At this juncture, Cosette spoke up and said that he was leaving for New York the next day. He had a good friend who was an assistant director on the Ed Sullivan Show and he would see what he could do to promote such an event.

True to his word, Cosette called us the next day and said that not only was Sullivan interested, but instead of Anderson making the trip east, he wanted to do a live shot from Reno.

Mapes was overjoyed at the prospect of turning the Sky Room into a TV station. His joy diminished, however, when I mentioned that there was a three-hour difference between New York and Reno and that we would have to fill the Sky Room with an audience at 5 pm.

Since we could not expect to get a full house at that early hour, I suggested to Mapes that we invite the first 150 members of the Prospectors' Club and their ladies to be Mapes' guests for the occasion. Mapes was a little taken aback by such a thought, but he concurred when I said we could charge the audience for drinks but give them a free dinner.

When the date for the Sunday show approached, the networks sent out three television cameras, a director and full crew and the show went on as scheduled.

It remains Reno's greatest television exposure.

# Nevada still leads nation in public worker pay

Once again Nevada has earned a worst-in-the-nation ranking.

An analysis of 2016 payroll data by Key Policy Data found Nevada's state and local public employees are the least productive in the country, according to a news account by Watchdog.org.

Though researcher J. Scott Moody found that Nevada's state and local governments employed only 11.7 people per every 100 workers in the taxpaying private sector, the lowest ratio in the nation and well below the national average of 15.7, Nevada pays those "public servants" far more than the private sector, the highest in the nation.

Public employees were paid 54 percent more than their counterparts in the private sector, which is 295 percent higher than the national average of 14 percent. The gap has grown like topsy, from only 6 percent in 1969 to today's 54 percent.

Moody said the driving factor for the gap are the benefits provided public employees, many growing due to union contracts.

In state and local benefits Nevada public employees were provided 286 percent more than those in the private sector, the highest benefit gap in the country, while the national average was 127 percent.

"It is unfair to private sector workers because they are ultimately footing the bill for these very generous benefits," Moody said. "Additionally, it hurts the private sector overall because it distorts the labor market as workers are enticed into the public sector. The private sector has to raise compensation to compete for labor, but that can make Nevada's businesses uncompetitive in the national or international marketplace."

He added that it is easy for politicians to "kick the can down the road" by increasing benefits today, knowing the bill won't come due for years or even decades. The bill is now coming due.

Here is how the compensation gap breaks down by county: In Carson City,

public employees are paid 258 percent more than private sector workers in total salary and benefits; Clark, +61 percent; Washoe County, +55 percent; Douglas, +46 percent; Lincoln, +46 percent; Lyon, +41 percent; Churchill, +37 percent; White Pine, +27 percent; Elko, +26 percent; Mineral, +21 percent; Nye, +19 percent; Humboldt, +15 percent; Storey, -20 percent; Lander, -22 percent; Pershing, -28 percent; Eureka, -41 percent; and Esmeralda, -47 percent.


It should be noted, according to the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation, that 88 percent of the jobs in Eureka are largely better paying mining jobs, while 60 percent of Lander's jobs are in mining, 52 percent of Esmeralda's and 30 percent of Pershing's. But only 1 percent of Storey's jobs are in mining. Go figure.

Michael Schaus, the communications director for the Nevada Policy Research Institute, blamed the compensation gap on local public worker labor unions.

"A big part of it is on the local level," Schaus said. "The local governments in Nevada tend to have very, very strong unions and as a result, every year they seem to get a little bit more pay, a little bit more benefits and, of course, that all comes out of the taxpayer pocket. State level employees, I don't believe that they've actually increased quite as fast and that's largely because they are not unionized."

As we have suggested editorially over the years, Moody recommends Nevada lawmakers change the retirement benefits for public employees from the current defined benefit program, which guarantees a percent of one's final salary for life upon retirement, usually well before the age of 65, to one similar to the 401(k) funds used in private industry.

It is time to put the brakes on what Nevada pays its "public servants." — **TM**

harassment.

Though the case involves the April 2014 effort by the BLM to impound 500 head of Bundy's cattle for failure to pay \$1 million in grazing fees over two decades for his Bunkerville ranch, arrests of the original 19 defendants were not made until early 2016, most remained jailed until recently on charges that include conspiracy, extortion, carrying a firearm during a crime of violence, threatening an officer and obstruction of justice. Conviction could result in 170 years in prison.

The BLM released the cattle rather than risk a shootout.

The complex case, which includes an estimated 1.4 terabytes of electronic evidence, was broken into three trials. The first ended in a mistrial. At retrial two were acquitted and two pleaded to misdemeanors and were released on time served.

The current trial is the second and a third is scheduled for 30 days after this one ends.

In arguing as to why the veil of secrecy should be lifted, McLetchie states that one of the most critical aspects of news reporting is to inform the public as to whether justice is being carried out, quoting a classic Supreme Court aphorism: "In short, justice must not only be done, it must be seen to be done."

McLetchie goes on to say, "This shroud of secrecy is anathema to the presumption under the First Amendment and the common law that all documents filed with a court are presumptively public documents open for review and inspection. Moreover, closing hearings and filing documents under seal has prevented intervenors from carrying out their constitutionally protected function of reporting

the news. This is troublesome given the importance of this case, and the public's right to know about the government's handling of its investigation and prosecution ..."

One of the documents apparently filed under seal — meaning the defendants can't even discuss it — is an 18-page Nov. 27 memo from a BLM investigator to a Justice Department attorney alleging "a widespread pattern of bad judgment, lack of discipline, incredible bias, unprofessionalism and misconduct, as well as likely policy, ethical, and legal violations" by BLM staffers involved in the Bundy case.

The memo was leaked to numerous newspapers. It is a rambling, often redundant, typo-filled diatribe against the agent's supervisors and prosecutors.

The agent said he was dismissed from reviewing the Bundy case in February and his files confiscated. "Futhermore," he wrote, "when I did report the misconduct, ethical, professional, and legal issues, I also became a victim of whistleblower retaliation." He wrote that he "feels" the prosecutor's judgment is "likely clouded by extreme personal and religious bias and a desire to win the case at all costs. I feel he is likely willing to ignore and fail to report exculpatory material, extreme bias and act unethically and possibly deceptively to win."

Though it may well be a self-serving effort on the part of a BLM staff member scorned, this is the very thing the public should be allowed to evaluate.

McLetchie notes the tradition of openness "serves as a check on the judiciary because the public can ensure that judges are not merely serving as a rubber stamp" for law enforcement.

ashamed or sorry I got this thing going," Reid told the Times. "I think it's one of the good things I did in my congressional service. I've done something that no one has done before."

It's surprising Sen. Reid didn't also call him self a "Guardian of the Galaxy" and a demand an ambassadorship to Mars.

Reid's curiously secret UFO program shut down in 2012 after the Pentagon finally became nervous about the spending priorities of the senator.

It's tempting to leave this story asking yourself what's wrong with the federal government that it can spend \$22 million in so-called "dark" money in secret and with zero public oversight?

Or, pass this episode off as another Reid stumble, like the time he welcomed New York Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand to the Senate by labeling her the "hottest" U.S. senator, or when he backed Barack Obama for president because he was "light skinned" and could "speak negro" any old time he needed to.

But is something more afoot?

The Times says the program secretly appropriated millions and some of it — how much? — came back to a friend of Reid's in Las Vegas.

I'm all for exploring the unknown. Let's find out more about the UFP.

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# Ex-federal official indicted in bribery scheme at Hoover Dam

RENO — A longtime former official for the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation in Nevada has been indicted on federal fraud charges for his alleged role in a bribery scheme involving a government contract at the Hoover Dam.

The grand jury indictment handed up Wednesday in federal court in Las Vegas accuses 46-year-old Fredrick Leavitt of Henderson of accepting a \$200,000 bribe to help steer a contract to a local accounting and tax firm in 2015.

A certified public accountant at the firm, 43-year-old Dustin Lewis of Henderson, also was named in the indictment. Both men face charges related to fraud conspiracy and bribing a public official, U.S. Attorney Steve Myhre said.

Leavitt worked 20 years for the Bureau of Reclamation, most recently as director of the financial management office for its Lower Colorado Region, which includes the dam east of Las Vegas on the Nevada-Arizona line.

Court records didn't list a lawyer for either. Their initial court appearance is scheduled Dec. 21 in U.S. District Court in Las Vegas.

Federal investigators announced in February 2016 they had launched a public corruption probe after the FBI raided the bureau's

regional office in Boulder City and searched Leavitt's home in Henderson. The Internal Revenue Service, the U.S. Interior Department's Office of Inspector General and Las Vega police's criminal intelligence section assisted in the investigation.

The indictment alleges that Leavitt provided Lewis with inside information in exchange for kickbacks connected to Lewis' firm securing a contract to conduct an audit of the California Public Power Authority's operations at the dam. The indictment says the two colluded to defraud the government and that Lewis ultimately transferred more than \$200,000 to Leavitt.

Among other things, Leavitt provided Lewis a copy of the audit selection committee's "score sheet" used in selecting the winning bid for the audit contract, the indictment said.

The bureau is the keeper of the levers that operate Hoover Dam and other Colorado River facilities providing drinking water and hydropower to about 40 million residents, farms, tribes and businesses in seven states in the Southwest.

According to the indictment, federal prosecutors are seeking criminal forfeiture totaling \$201,250 from Leavitt, including a 2016 Mercedes Benz sports car. They're seeking \$704,002 from Lewis.

said in a statement Wednesday.

The water at issue is inside cracks within fractured rocks and is not the water that runs off mountains to supply cities and farms. The amount lost in 2011-2015 was 45 times the amount that Los Angeles uses in a year, according to the study published in the Journal of Geophysical Research: Solid Earth.

The north-south-trending Sierra Nevada runs about 400 miles (644 kilometers) along California's border with Nevada.

The study used data from 1,300 Global Positioning System stations in the mountains of California, Oregon

and Washington that were placed for measurement of subtle tectonic motion in active faults and volcanoes and can detect elevation changes of less than a tenth of an inch (0.3 centimeters).

"One of the major unknowns in mountain hydrology is what happens below the soil. How much snowmelt percolates through fractured rock straight downward into the core of the mountain?" said Jay Famiglietti, jet propulsion lab scientist who participated in the research. "This is one of the key topics that we addressed in our study."

The researchers had to account for other reasons why the surface of the Earth rises and falls, including tectonic uplift or the extensive pumping of groundwater in the Central Valley, which runs along the Sierra.


