Plans announced for groundbreaking ceremony of Veterans Memorial Plaza

A new veterans memorial is going into the Sparks Marina, and the city is inviting everyone to partake in the March 29 celebration of the Veterans Memorial Plaza groundbreaking event.

Starting at 10 a.m., Sparks city councilmembers, state congressmen and government representatives from Henderson and Las Vegas will be around to offer their support of this new plaza. There will be a flag ceremony, Melissa Dahir will be singing the National Anthem and the first 300 attendees will receive a commemorative vest.

The new Nevada Veterans Memorial Plaza is a statewide remembrance site where at least 834 servicemen and women will be recognized. The idea to build a veterans' memorial in Sparks came about when Mayor Ron Smith expressed an interest in building something for Nevada's military and was then looking at a site near the Southeast Connector linking Sparks Boulevard to Veterans Parkway in Reno. However, when the Nevada Veterans Memorial Plaza (NVMP) committee discussed it further, it seemed that the Sparks Marina would be a better location as that area gets more walking traffic and a better opportunity for the community to interact with it.

"This is a place of honor and we want to make sure that their memory gets passed down to future generations," says NVMP Committee Member and Sparks City Councilman Kristopher Dahir.

The project will cost a total of \$2.2 million to complete. So far \$900,000 has been raised to start the construction.

The project has been broken out into three phases; the first being the construction of the plaza, then adding the veterans' names and bricks; and the third will be adding interactive kiosks and education supplements, money permitting.

Dahir became involved with the Veterans Memorial Plaza when he met Sparks Mayor Ron Smith, who initiated the project.

"After he had been working on it for a bit, I got to know Ron and I wanted to help. I joined the board and we have a great committee who has done a lot of work to make this happen, like putting on golf tournaments and special events to raise money," he says. Kristopher adds that the biggest hurdle in planning the project was finding the most appropriate location in Sparks to place it.

"We wanted it where the community could be involved with it as they walked by," he says. "As people walk around the marina, they get to learn everything that has been sacrificed for them. Our freedom is not free and it's important to honor these folks who fought so hard for our independence and keep their memory alive," Kristopher says.

Names of those who have served in every kind of Nevada battle will be remembered and there will also be room for new names who may need to be added serving in current combat. There are 151 names of Vietnam veterans who will be added to the memorial including some who have served in the

Civil War.

After the plaza is built (by Memorial Day 2019) the NVMP committee hopes to make the plaza more interactive and conducive to learning by building kiosks with information and a smartphone app that can help direct people and maybe offer additional videos and collaborating components.

"The hope is that kids will be able to tour around, participate in trivia, get to learn and see and get their hands on what happened," says Kristopher.

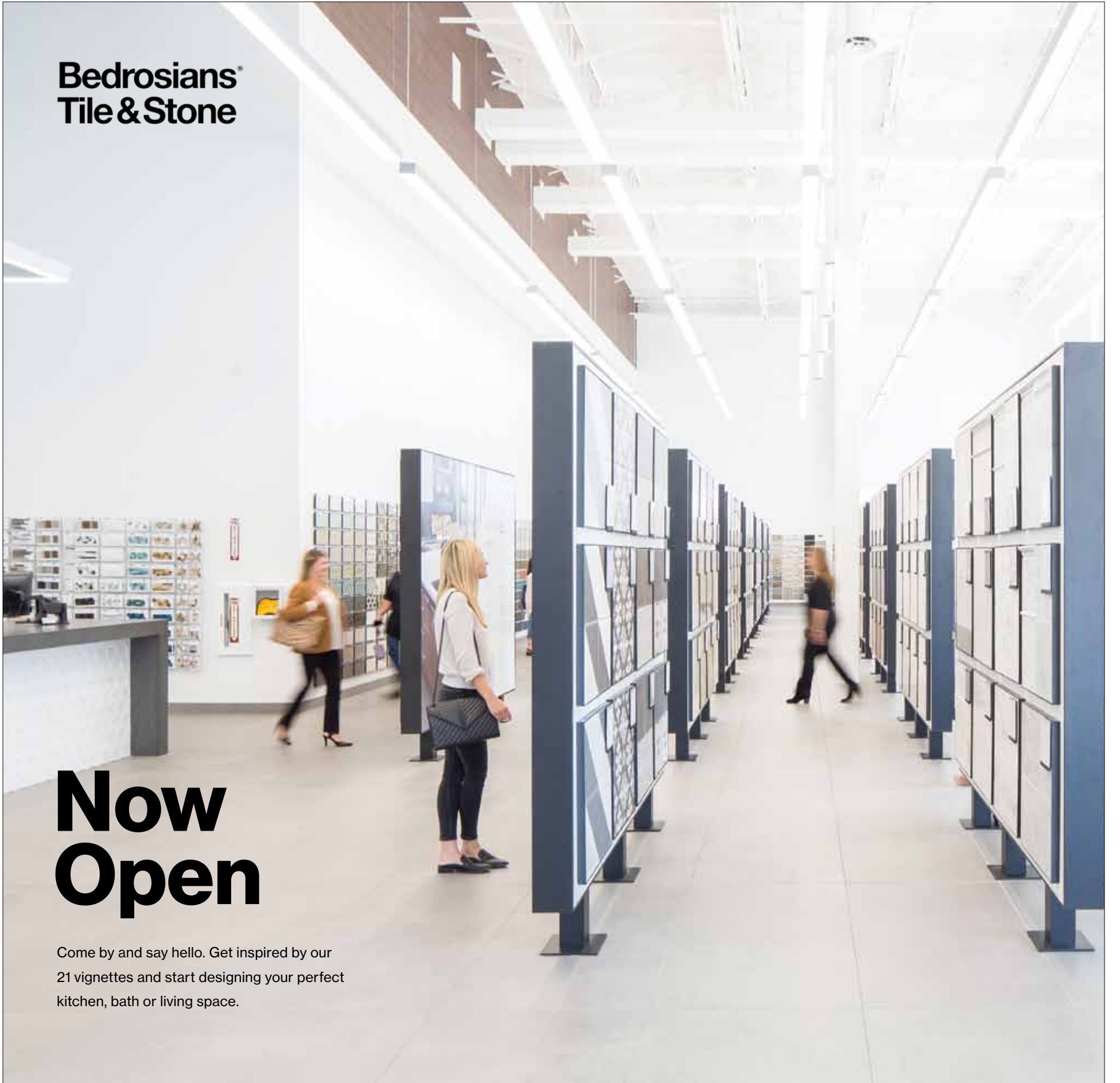
Those interested in being a part of the memorial plaza can buy an engraved brick ranging from \$100 to \$1000 depending on the size.

"There is a (statewide memorial) in Vegas and one in Carson City with names on it, but I believe that this one is a whole culmination and a way for people to come together and honor those names," Kristopher says. "This is for the community and we'd love to see everyone come out," he adds.

STRONG WINDS CAUSE POWER OUTAGES IN RENO-SPARKS

RENO — A fierce winter storm packing winds in excess of 100 mph (160 kph) and predicted to bring as much as 8 feet (2.4 meters) of snow to the Sierra Nevada barreled into the West Coast on Monday, toppling trucks, triggering power outages and temporarily closing the major highway near Reno.

Winds gusting to 110 mph (177 kph) were recorded at the summit of the Squaw Valley ski resort near Lake Tahoe, and up to 84 mph (135 kph) in the valleys along the Sierra's eastern front where Interstate 580 was closed off and on between Reno and Carson City.

Two trucks overturned on I-580 and another on nearby U.S. 395 in the Washoe Valley, where one non-life threatening injury was reported.

At one point as many as 6,000 NV Energy customers were without power in the Reno-Sparks area, but power had been restored to about half by Monday afternoon.

POLICE: MOM KILLED 2-YEAR-OLD, STABBED SELF IN VEGAS HOME

LAS VEGAS — A 21-year-old mother who was described by family members as depressed since giving birth two years ago fatally stabbed her young son and wounded herself with a knife Monday, Las Vegas police said.

The boy's father and a cousin broke through a door to a bedroom where the woman refused to come out and

found the child dead on a bed moments before patrol officers arrived, said Lt. Ray Spencer.

The woman's name wasn't immediately released. She was hospitalized in serious but stable condition.

"If she lives, she's going to be facing a charge of open murder," Spencer said.

He said the female cousin also lived in the house south of McCarran International Airport. She told police she hadn't seen the child since Sunday and had been talking to the woman through the door until about 15 minutes before police arrived.

ATTORNEY TO CHALLENGE MURDER CHARGE IN 1986 MISSING BOY CASE

LAS VEGAS — A defense attorney says he'll challenge a murder charge against a 60-year-old woman arrested last month in Boca Raton, Florida, after police in Nevada reopened their probe of the disappearance of her 3-year-old son in 1986.

Amy Elizabeth Fleming is due in court Thursday for her lawyer, Nicholas Wooldridge, to ask a judge to reduce her \$1 million bail.

Wooldridge said Monday he plans in coming days to also seek dismissal of the case.

He says there's new evidence, and North Las Vegas police and prosecutors have improperly gone public with details about the investigation.

Fleming's son, Francillon Pierre, was never found after Fleming and then-fiance Lee Luster said he wandered away from a swap meet.

Prosecutors now say letters Fleming wrote in 1986 and new wit-

ness accounts support the murder charge.

RARE SNOWFALL IN LAS VEGAS SEES DROP IN SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

LAS VEGAS — Rare snowfall in Las Vegas caused a sizable drop in public school attendance on Thursday even though schools remained open.

The Las Vegas Review-Journal reports that only 74 percent of Clark County School District's students showed up Thursday, down from 92 percent the day before.

Some parents apparently thought the weather rarity in the desert city was too much to be missed.

Lifelong Las Vegas resident Jennifer Warnick said she was stunned by the snowfall and couldn't have her five children miss the experience of having snow in their backyard.

The district late Thursday ordered schools closed Friday because concerns about driving conditions due to black ice forming on roads, so the Warnicks went sledding and had a snowball fight at a park Friday.

RENO SUSPECT IN DEATH OF SPARKS MAN AT TAHOE SUICIDE VICTIM

RENO — Sheriff's deputies in Northern California say a 52-year-old Reno man who was a suspect in a fatal shooting in Tahoe City last weekend has died of an apparent suicide.

The Placer County sheriff's office said Thursday they had identified Salvador Murillo Cabrera as a suspect in the killing of 33-year-old Octavio Villa Villanueva of Sparks Satur-

day evening at the Boatworks Mall in Tahoe City, California.

The sheriff's office says investigators were awaiting ballistic results when they determined Cabrera was deceased and apparently committed suicide.

Detectives say the victim and the suspect were former co-workers at a restaurant in Tahoe City.

They say the suspect believed the victim was having an affair with his wife but investigators don't know if that was true.

KRNV-TV reported Cabrera was found dead Sunday in a church in Sun Valley north of Reno.

4-HOUR SWAT STANDOFF AT RENO APARTMENT ENDS WITH ARREST

RENO — Reno police arrested a 32-year-old man armed with a knife who barricaded himself inside an apartment with a woman during a four-hour standoff with a SWAT team.

Police say they were called to the apartment southeast of downtown on a report of a domestic disturbance at about 6:50 a.m. Thursday.

Officers were able to rescue the woman through the back of the residence before the suspect, Donald Thomas, was arrested when he tried to flee the scene at about 11 a.m.

Thomas was taken to a local hospital for an evaluation and later booked into the Washoe County Jail on charges of kidnapping, domestic battery, obstructing and resisting and preventing a 911 call.

It wasn't clear if he had a lawyer or would be appointed one at a pending court appearance.



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CITY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

The following are highlights from Monday's Sparks City Council Meeting:

PROCLAMATION

The National Organization for Rare Disorders organized a nationwide observance of Rare Disease Day. Sparks City Council proclaimed February 28 as Rare Disease Day to draw attention to the one in 10 Americans that have rare diseases.

GENERAL BUSINESS

• The Sparks City Council directed the City Attorney to actively prosecute the case currently pending as City of Sparks v. IPC D'Andrea LLC, Case Number CV17-01066. On March 27, 2017, the City Council authorized the City Attorney to seek declaratory and injunctive relief to abate the nuisance conditions on the property at 2900 South D'Andrea Parkway, the home of the former D'Andrea Golf Club. Based on that authorization, the City filed a complaint in State court in June 2017, seeking a court order declaring the property a nuisance and ordering the property owner to demolish the ruins of the clubhouse and otherwise abate the dangerous nuisance conditions on the property. Upon agreement between the parties, the litigation was stayed several times between November 2017 and October 2018 while the property owner was trying to sell the property. While the litigation was stayed, the property owner or its agents took steps toward clean-

ing up the property. The vast majority of the debris from the clubhouse, which burned in 2015, was removed from the site and weeds have been removed from the perimeter of the property to create defensible space between the property and adjacent homes. However, weeds still cover much of the former golf course, the clubhouse and other structures remain abandoned, and complaints to the City's Code Enforcement team are ongoing. Although the property owner had secured the clubhouse, some of the boards securing the building have been removed. Other evidence of recent vandalism, such as graffiti, is also present. In addition, fifty-five-gallon drums were observed at the maintenance building on the property.

• Council directed the City Manager and City Attorney's office to institute proceedings to revoke NNV Operations I Inc. dba Silver State Trading's cultivation and production business licenses due to late quarterly licensing payments to the city of Sparks. These quarterly license fees are due no later than 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter.

• The council confirmed the Mayor's appointment of Neil Krutz as the city of Sparks new City Manager, effective March 15, 2019. Council also approved the Employment agreement between the city of Sparks and Mr. Krutz for a yearly salary of \$223,100.80. Current Sparks City Manager Steve Driscoll will retire on March 14.

Nevada lawmakers hear arguments on assisted suicide bill

CARSON CITY — Nevada lawmakers are once again considering legislation to allow terminal patients to kill themselves with medication prescribed by a doctor.

Republican lawmakers on Monday raised questions over patient safeguards and patient competency and coercion, among other specifics in the Democrat-backed legislation. The measure, heard at a packed Senate committee meeting Monday afternoon, would make Nevada the seventh state to enact similar laws.

Supporters argue the legislation will let the patients who are suffering die with dignity and end their pain.

Opponents argue the measure gives insurance companies the ability to defer to physician-assisted suicide instead of paying for higher cost treatment. Other opponents argued the bill will lead to abuse against people with disabilities and give some an easy path to suicide.

Kristen Hanson with Patients Rights Action Fund told lawmakers about her husband, who was diagnosed with brain cancer and told he had only months to live. Her husband outlived the prognosis by more than three and a half years, but he could have had the life-ending medication available to him on his darkest days had it been legalized, she said.

"If he had suicide pills, he said that he might have

taken them. And you can't undo that. You can't unmake that choice," she said.

The medication under the bill would only be provided to adults who are diagnosed to be within six months of death and are of "sound mental health."

Advocate and bill supporter Dan Diaz told lawmakers about his wife Brittany Maynard, who attracted national attention over the right to die. Maynard's family moved to Oregon from California so she could legally take the lethal medication.

"A terminally ill individual that applies for this option is not deciding between living and dying. This is not

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Democrats list top legislative policy priorities in 'Blueprint'

Nevada's Democratic legislative leaders are vowing to increase the minimum wage, tackle surprise emergency room bills and ban for-profit, private prisons this session with the help of the state's first Democratic governor in two decades.

Those promises came in the form of the third iteration of the "Nevada Blueprint," a broad policy wishlist highlighting the priorities of legislative Democrats presented by Assembly Speaker Jason Frierson and Senate Majority Leader Kelvin Atkinson on Monday. Though none of the priorities listed on it are new, the document summarizes progressive policy goals espoused by lawmakers and Gov. Steve Sisolak into one place.

Unlike the 2015 and 2017 iterations of the "Blueprint" which contained pie-in-the-sky proposals unlikely to be signed into law by a Republican governor, the 2019 version represents

a likely roadmap for which policy areas Democrats will prioritize this legislative session. The six issues highlighted by Democrats in the document include education, health care, economic security, keeping a "business-friendly climate," security, a "fair system for all" and renewable energy and environmental issues.

"Nevadans are expecting us to deliver on meaningful results," Frierson said during a Monday press conference. "In the weeks coming ahead, we're going to break ground on legislation that will do several things, that will provide greater economic success for Nevadans, introduce new resources for improving our public schools, it will expand access to high quality and affordable health care and it will promote a cleaner environment and make our community safer."

Few of the highlighted policy areas include specifics, such as broad calls to increase the minimum wage, increase the state's renew-

able portfolio standard and address surprise emergency room bills from hospitals. Atkinson and Frierson also declined to answer specific questions on the policies, saying it was the fourth week of the Legislature and that it would take time for details on specific bills or policy ideas.

During the press conference, Frierson bristled at suggestions that Republicans were upset with the legislative process, saying when the tables were turned in the 2015 session, Republicans used their majority to "demolish" the construction-defect industry through introducing bills as emergency measures and rushing them through the legislative process.

"You can lead and be effective in the minority," he said. "But it's not by sitting back and lamenting the fact that you're in the minority. It is sitting down with the majority party and engaging in a meaningful way so we can have conversations about middle ground and common ground."

Some of the priorities in-

cluded in the blueprint were touted by Sisolak during his State of the State Address, including allowing state employees to collectively bargain, creating the Governor's Office for New Americans, expanding women's access to health care and teacher pay raises. Sisolak has proposed \$242 million in funds for the pay raises and \$6 million for family planning services in his two-year budget.

Pressed about whether the Office for New Americans would serve undocumented Nevadans, Sisolak said last month that prominent DREAMer immigrant Astrid Silva would be welcome at the center. But Atkinson expressed less certainty at the press conference.

"Undocumented, I don't know if that's the case," Atkinson said.

Others already have bills tied to them. A promise to "make college more affordable" may be addressed through the Senate Education Committee's proposed Battle Born Opportunity Grant, a need-based scholar-

ship for university students, while Assemblywoman Daniele Monroe-Moreno has proposed legislation to ban private prisons.

The document also embraces some specific proposals that either failed to pass in previous legislative sessions or were vetoed by former Gov. Brian Sandoval, including a ban on private prisons, earned paid sick days, collective bargaining for state employees, restoring the prevailing wage on school construction projects, building a "community-based solar energy program" and raising the renewable portfolio standard.

At least one of the highlighted goals to "implement background checks on all gun purchases" has already been addressed — Sisolak signed SB143 earlier this month, which requires background checks on almost all gun sales and transfers in the state.

Pack falls six spots in rankings after split

Nevada fell six spots in Monday's AP Top 25 poll to No. 12 after splitting a pair of games last week.

The Wolf Pack (25-2, 12-2) dropped its second game of the season to San Diego State last Wednesday on the road, 65-57, before rebounding with a hard fought 74-68 win on Saturday against Fresno State.

It was the biggest dip in the rankings this season for Nevada. Earlier this year they fell four spots to No. 10 after a loss to New Mexico before ripping off 10 straight wins entering their first meeting with the Aztecs.

Nevada now just sits a half game ahead of Utah State in the Mountain West Conference standings with four games left in the regular season. They host UNLV tonight before a critical matchup with the Aggies Saturday in Logan that will play a big factor in who claims the conference championship.

The Pack's last two games before the Mountain West tournament are at Air Force and home against San Diego State next week.

NEVADA 74, FRESNO STATE 68

RENO — After a loss in the last game, Nevada coach Eric Musselman told forward Tre'Shawn Thurman he would not start the next game. It's something he also did after the Wolf Pack's first loss of the season back in January, and they bounced back with wins both times.

Thurman had 14 points, a team-high 10 rebounds and four assists to help No. 6 Nevada narrowly avoid losing back-to-back games for the first time this season, beating Fresno State 74-68 Saturday night.

"We've lost two games now this year and both games I pulled Thurman out of the starting lineup, and he's responded," Musselman said. "We don't win the game tonight without Tre having a really, really good game."

Caleb Martin led the Wolf Pack with 24 points, Jordan Caroline added 17 and Jazz Johnson had 10 in his first start of the season.

Nevada (25-2, 12-2 Mountain West) trailed 62-60 with 4:34 left, but went on an 8-0 run over the next two minutes to grab its largest lead of the game.

When Fresno State pulled within three with 44 seconds left, Thurman dribbled from the wing and dunked on Fresno State's New Williams, which sealed the win for the Wolf Pack.

"I thought about passing it out to run some clock out," said Thurman,

an Omaha transfer and fifth-year senior. "Somebody drove and freed me up, and when I pumped fake, I saw there was an opening, so I took it and went with it."

Fresno State (19-8, 10-5) matched Nevada with 32 rebounds and outscored the Wolf Pack 28-20 in the paint.

"Guys are fighting, guys are pushing, guys are clawing, guys want to win," Thurman said "That team wanted to win, it was definitely a tough game. The refs just let us play."

Fresno State jumped to a fast start, connecting on its first four shots — all 3-pointers — en route to an early 12-6 lead.

Nevada shot 62 percent from beyond the arc in the first half to take a 42-39 lead at the break. The Wolf Pack finished 54 percent on 3s for the game.

Fresno State held Nevada to 33 percent shooting in the second half.

Deshon Taylor led Fresno State with 30 points on 11-for-19 shooting. Taylor's effort mirrored his performance last time he played at Nevada and had a career-high 32 points on Jan. 31, 2018.

Nevada, which was coming off 65-57 loss at San Diego State on Wednesday, has four games remaining before the conference tournament, and then NCAA Tournament.

"We're at the home stretch," Johnson said. "There's the tournament talks and all that stuff. ... Guys can kind of look at that and look forward. The biggest thing is we have to stay focused on each game, especially with this stretch coming up."

INJURY REPORT

Musselman said several of his players were dealing with some injuries, but knows all teams go through that at this point of the season.

"(Cody Martin) got a pretty bad

bone bruise against San Diego State and struggled," Musselman said. "Caleb still has issues he is dealing with and, obviously, Jazz's (Johnson) shoulder has kind of been a chronic thing. I'm sure if you ask Fresno, they have the same thing. ... We've always finished strong and we hope that we can do it again this year."

Johnson said his shoulder injury has lingered throughout his career since he was a freshman, but that he is working through it. He played a season-high 40 minutes Saturday.

SDSU 65, NEVADA 57

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State stunned the No. 6 Wolf Pack 65-57 last Wednesday night, shutting down Jordan Caroline, snapping the Wolf Pack's 10-game winning streak and prompting the reinvigorated student section to rush Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena, which was incredibly loud and sold out for the first time this season.

Nevada has lost only five games since late last season, including falling just a basket short of reaching the Elite Eight. Three of those defeats have been to the Aztecs. No other Division I team has beaten the same ranked opponent three times during the last year.

It was the highest-ranked opponent the Aztecs have ever beaten.

"We have to step up on a big stage and play," said Musselman. "We've played in front of two really great crowds at New Mexico and here and we didn't play like we are capable of."

Caroline had only eight points and six rebounds.

"Mostly everyone we play plays zone defense," Caroline said. "So I think their man defense affected our offense a little bit."

Cougar girls capture first regional title

The Spanish Springs girls basketball team made history over the weekend in Carson City after claiming its first 4A regional girls basketball title in school history.

Entering the single-elimination tournament as the No. 2 seed, the Cougs knocked off a pair of No. 1 seeds to capture the title, including a 54-40 win over Reno in Saturday's championship game. The Huskies won both matchups between the two schools in the regular season by single digits, but the Cougs couldn't be beaten a third time.

Spanish Springs came out of the gates strong and led 23-16 at half-time, but it was the third quarter that ended up being the turning point in the game. The Cougs outscored Reno 17-9 in the third to take a commanding 15-point lead heading into the final quarter where they would eventually put Reno away.

Both teams advanced to the state tournament in Las Vegas this week by reaching the title game.

The Cougs opened the tournament

on Thursday with a 58-46 win over Damonte Ranch before knocking off the top seed from the Sierra League Bishop Manogue in a thriller on Fri-

day. The Cougs had a commanding 38-24 lead at the half, but were outscored 24-5 in the third quarter before storming back to win 57-54.

With the wins, the Cougs received a first round bye in the state tournament and will play either Bishop Gorman or Canyon Springs tomorrow at 4:45 p.m. at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. On the other side of the bracket, the winner of the Reno and Desert Oasis game tonight will play Centennial tomorrow night for the right to play in the state title game on Friday at 6:10 p.m.

REED ELIMINATED EARLY

The Raiders season came to an end earlier than they had hoped last Wednesday when they fell 46-40 at Douglas in the quarterfinals of the regional tournament.

Reed entered the tournament as the No. 3 seed and gave Douglas a fight before coming up just short. Douglas led 27-23 at the half and only entered the fourth quarter with a two-point lead, but made some key plays down the stretch to hold off the visitors.

The Raiders ended the season 9-11 overall after finishing 4-4 in High Desert League play.

Cougs fall in title game but advance to state; Raiders stunned in semis

Saturday's 4A regional championship game was full of emotions and plenty of drama, and in the end Bishop Manogue came out on top of Spanish Springs 42-40 to claim the regional title.

In front of a packed gym in Carson City, the Cougs struggled in the early part of the game and fell behind 29-15 at halftime. But as expected, they got off the mat and came out swinging in the second half and eventually took a late 40-38 lead in the final minute.

However, with 16 seconds left in the game, Manogue senior Kolton Frugoli hit a pair of free throws to tie the game and then forced a turnover on the other end to get the ball back. With a little over two seconds to play, Frugoli hit a jumper as time expired to win the regional championship for his team.

Despite the loss, the Cougs still advanced to the state tournament in Las Vegas this week.

Leo Grass finished with 16 points for Spanish Springs and DJ Panfli had seven.

Friday night, Grass scored 20 and Mason Whittaker 14 in a 51-44 win over No. 2 seed Galena.

Whittaker led the way with 17 points and 13 rebounds in the quarterfinal opening win against Damonte Ranch last Tuesday, 67-41.

Spanish Springs is set to play Arbor View tonight in the opening round of the state tournament at 4:45 p.m. in Las Vegas on the campus of Arbor View. The winner will play Bishop Gorman tomorrow night at the Orleans Arena at 6:30 p.m.

On the other side of the bracket, Bishop Manogue awaits the winner of tonight's game between Desert Pines and Clark. The championship game is set for Friday at the Orleans at 8:10 p.m.

REED FALLS IN SEMIS

Reed had its season ended in heartbreaking fashion Thursday after losing at the buzzer to Bishop Manogue, 43-41.

National Popular Vote bill would dilute Nevada vote

Democratic lawmakers in Carson City are at it again, bound and determined to give your presidential ballots to the voters of California and New York.

Two years ago — after Donald Trump won the Electoral College vote by 304 to 227, though Hillary Clinton won the popular vote by 2.9 million individual votes — a bill was introduced that would have had Nevada join in something called the “Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.”

Instead of awarding Nevada’s six electoral votes — one for each representative and senator in Congress — according to how Nevadans vote, those six electoral votes would be awarded to the president and vice president team that wins the popular vote nationally.

This essentially cuts the value of Nevada’s votes from six to four, since the votes nationwide would be proportional to population and exclude the power of our two senators, thus diluting our voting power.

Backers say the compact would become a reality if it is adopted by states possessing a combined 270 electoral votes, or a majority of the 538 electoral votes.

Fortunately, the bill went nowhere then.

But a group of Democratic lawmakers have dragged its carcass out of the slag heap and dumped it out as Assembly Bill 186. It is being discussed this week.

A similar bill was passed in Colorado this past week, giving the proposal 181 electoral votes, just 89 votes short of becoming binding.

The Founders established the nation on a federalist system, not a democracy. Certain enumerated powers were assigned to the federal government while the rest were reserved to the people and the sovereign states. The sovereignty of the states was so important that U.S. senators — until 1913’s 17th Amendment — were chosen by state Legislatures, not directly by the voters. That is also why the Electoral College was created to give added weight to

Court ruling will curb asset forfeiture abuses

The U.S. Supreme Court has finally brought the hammer down on the abusive law enforcement practice of civil asset forfeitures — seizing of cars, money and property simply because it might have some tenuous link to some alleged crime.

The court has unanimously ruled that such seizures can violate the Eighth Amendment prohibition against excessive fines. The case involved Indiana resident Tyson Timbs, who was convicted of selling \$385 worth of cocaine in 2013. He

only to the federal government and not to the state, but the justices ruled that the Due Process Clause of the 14th Amendment, passed after the Civil War, makes the Eighth Amendment applicable to states as well.

The high court opinion penned by Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg noted, “When ratified in 1791, the Bill of Rights applied only to the Federal Government. ... ‘The constitutional Amendments adopted in the after-

I promise confidentiality to patients. It is a holy promise. I lock the stories I hear in a vault inside of me utterly defended. With the exceptions of children being hurt, or my duty to respond to threats to self or others, I wouldn't talk even if not talking put me in some jeopardy. Because, if I did betray this trust just to save my own bacon, I'd be violating a value that would bring consequences to me way beyond lawsuits or sanctions from my peers.

See, I don't maintain confidentiality because HIPPA laws require it. I don't uphold this promise because every known standard of professional ethics demands it. I keep it because there is no holier, vulnerable or powerful place to meet human beings than in their suffering. The torments and tortures of the soul. The despair. The losses. The dark, bitter hatred that is harbored in the human heart. The sordid fantasies. Egregious moral failures. Or less egregious but nonetheless corrosive, hidden habits of vice of which we are ashamed. I maintain confidentiality because every human heart contains these things. And these things can only be dealt with in the sacred space of trust.

My early training was as a pastoral counselor. My former life as a parish priest likely puts a particular spin on confidentiality for me. When you hear a confession, the responsibility makes you tremble somewhere inside. A colleague once asked me, "So, if Timothy McVeigh had stopped in Las Vegas and sacramentally confessed to you that he was on his way to Oklahoma to kill people, what would you do?" I thought about it for a moment and said, "I'd call the police and report him ... and then I'd surrender my clerical collar to the bishop and find some other way to make a living."

I'm saying that doing my duty to stop a great evil would still have consequences for the promise.

Years ago, I was trying to explain confidentiality to my youngest son, age 10. He listened patiently. I asked him if he understood. And, wise old soul that he is, he said, "You keep everything a secret so people don't make fun of them about their problems." Just left me shaking my head. Yeah, dear boy, you get it. Exposure of the soul to uninvited, gleeful observers is a potentially lethal humiliation.

He makes me think of the "Facebook suicides." Now, please, that's just jargon. I'm not blaming Facebook for teen suicide. I mean the term to point more generally to our world of cyberspace, which at once wraps us in an illusory sense

of anonymity yet exposes us without boundaries to the world. I once acquired a stalker who hacked in to my computer, where she sent emails to several women in my address book as

if they were from me. I was terrified to read recently that people can hack cell phones. We've become a culture of opportunistic voyeurs and unwitting exhibitionists. If someone with power decided to ruin you, well, it's never been easier.

In graduate school, I read an account of early American puritans forcing known adulterers to disrobe before the congregation, then marched them naked to the stocks. I remember thinking this behavior was a far greater evil than any adultery could possibly be. It spoke to something sick and twisted in the heart of the congregation. The National Enquirer says, "For inquiring minds." But they mean prurient minds, and in some cases sadistic curiosity.

Over time, I have developed a kind of "psychic muscle" for confidentiality. It's a reflexive habit now, rather than a great effort. In some strange way, the confidentiality even keeps the information away from me. I mean that, once the unlovely story is told, I find that I don't keep track of the unlovely story. When, by chance, I should cross paths with former patients years later, it's not the mistakes and failures that I'm focused on. I often don't remember them. What I celebrate is the courageous way patients have embraced those unlovely events and turned them into redemption, humility, creativity, gratitude, and commitments to live with integrity and meaning.

You don't have to be a counselor or a priest to accept a pilgrim's entrustment of some personal darkness or gaping vulnerability. Real friends do this. Loving family does this. It is our honor to guard these treasures, and take them quietly to our graves.

Think about the people who have and are faithfully guarding your treasures, and be grateful.

Ex-Nevadan wrongly imprisoned accuses Reno of cruelty

RENO — Nearly three years after a former Nevada woman filed a lawsuit seeking compensation for spending more than three decades in prison for a murder she didn't commit, her lawyers say the city of Reno is continuing to do everything it can to delay and deny her justice.

The latest dispute over Cathy Woods' lawsuit centers on the city's insistence she travel from her home in Washington state to provide a deposition in preparation for a trial still months away.

Woods' lawyers say she suffers from mental illness exacerbated by 35 years of wrongful imprisonment for a 1976 murder, and she's too mentally fragile to make the trip.

"There is a stunning cruelty in the Reno defendants' approach to this issue," her attorney David Owens wrote in a motion filed Feb. 18 in federal court in Reno. To them, "the fact that she was wrongfully convicted is

her fault."

Woods, 68, who now lives near Anacortes, Washington, is seeking unspecified damages from Reno, ex-prosecutors and police she accuses of coercing a fabricated confession from her while she was a patient at a Louisiana mental hospital in 1979.

Woods received inadequate mental treatment, including electroshock therapy, during decades of imprisonment and still suffers from severe paranoid schizophrenia, her lawyers say.

She was released from prison four years ago when newly available DNA evidence from a crime-scene cigarette butt linked the 1976 killing of a 19-year-old Reno college student to an Oregon inmate, Rodney Halbower.

Detectives in Reno and Northern California subsequently identified him as the "Gypsy Hills Killer." He was convicted last September of the 1976 killings of two teens in the San Francisco Bay Area and sentenced to life in prison.

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a right-to-life or right-to-choose issue," he said. "The option of living (was) no longer on the table for Brittany."

Diaz said large majorities in Nevada and nationwide agree that terminally ill people should have the right to die.

Peg Sandeen, executive director of the Death with Dignity National Center, gave an overview of the bill to lawmakers and said she supports the option only being used by a limited number of people.

The non-profit organization reports that six states have such statutes, including California, Washington and Colorado.

Two physicians must determine a patient is competent under the bill and just more than 1,000 people have used the law in 20 years in Oregon, she said.

"It's a very rarely used option at the end of life," she said.

Physician-assisted suicide legislation narrowly passed the Nevada Senate last legislative session by an 11-10 vote. The measure did not cross the finish line in the Assembly.

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math of the Civil War,' however, 'fundamentally altered our country's federal system.' ... With only 'a handful' of exceptions, this Court has held that the Fourteenth Amendment's Due Process Clause incorporates the protections contained in the Bill of Rights, rendering them applicable to the States."

Ginsburg also noted that the concept of prohibiting excessive fines dates to the Magna Carta, which required economic sanctions "be proportioned to the wrong" and "not be so large as to deprive [an offender] of his livelihood."

Wesley Hottot, an attorney with the Institute for Justice, who argued the case on behalf of Timbs before the court in November, said the "ruling should go a long way to curtailing what is often called 'policing for profit' — where police and prosecutors employ forfeiture to take someone's property then sell it, and keep the profits to fund their departments. This gives them a direct financial incentive to abuse this power and impose excessive fines."

Justices Clarence Thomas and Neil Gorsuch concurred with the court's conclusion but quibbled on how the Constitution should be interpreted to reach that conclusion. Thomas' concurring opinion said the case has nothing to do with due process but rather strikes to the core protection afforded by the 14th Amendment, which protects privileges and immunities.

The 14th reads in part: "No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws."

Asset forfeitures arguably constitute due process, but certainly can abridge the immu-

nity from excessive fines.

Thomas recounted that the 14th Amendment was specifically passed to address this very issue of excessive fines that were passed in Southern states as part of the Black Codes.

"For example," Thomas wrote, "under Mississippi law, adult 'freedmen, free negroes and mulattoes' 'without lawful employment' faced \$50 in fines and 10 days' imprisonment for vagrancy. ... Those convicted had five days to pay or they would be arrested and leased to 'any person who will, for the shortest period of service, pay said fine and forfeiture and all costs.' ... Members of Congress criticized such laws 'for selling [black] men into slavery in punishment of crimes of the slightest magnitude.'"

Thomas concluded, "The attention given to abusive fines at the time of the Fourteenth Amendment, along with the ubiquity of state excessive-fines provisions, demonstrates that the public continued to understand the prohibition on excessive fines to be a fundamental right of American citizenship."

This ruling should help curb asset forfeiture abuses that have occurred in Nevada. In 2013 police seized \$167,000 from a man driving a motor home through Elko County. A judge later ordered the money returned.

Over a two-year period Humboldt County deputies seized \$180,000 in cash from motorists. One deputy was caught on tape telling a tourist, "You'll burn it up in attorney fees before we give it back to you."

The U.S. attorney's office in Las Vegas demanded a local woman forfeit the \$76,667 in salary she earned while running an office for her brother, who was later convicted of mortgage fraud. A federal judge called the forfeiture effort an "egregious miscarriage of justice."

This ruling should put a stop to such abuses.

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Nevada History: Fishing on Winnemucca Lake

Demand for fresh fish during the Comstock boom days was met by resourceful fishermen who brought their catch to market from Stillwater Marsh east of Fallon and from Pyramid and Winnemucca lakes. Some of the local Indians made a good living bringing wagonloads of salmon-like cutthroat trout to the gourmet restaurants and fish markets in Virginia City and other Western Nevada markets.

When Fremont first came through the area on his expedition of 1843-44, he discovered Pyramid Lake. Just east of there was a large basin that was nothing more than a dry alkali flat at that time, with a small puddle at one end. It became known as Mud Lake. In 1862, there was a major flood that filled the basin to a depth of about 80 feet. The lake was then renamed Winnemucca Lake after Paiute Indian Chief Winnemucca.

Before long, the lake supported a large population of salmon-sized cutthroat trout. Fishing on the lake became so productive that several boats, including at least one

steamer named the Wm. Jamison, were used to catch the fish and bring them to a cannery that was set up at Wadsworth. In the 1880s, a substantial fishing camp was established about 25 miles north of Gerlach on the shore of Winnemucca Lake. The camp was operated by a man known only as Adobe Charlie. He had several fishing boats and operated a convenience store where he sold drinks, snacks and fishing tackle.

Even though the level of the lake was beginning to drop dangerously low by the late 1920s, Adobe Charlie decided to construct a new boat

where he could take fishermen, girls and drinkers out to party during the Prohibition days. The boat was a side paddle-wheeler propelled by a model-T Ford engine. When the beautiful new boat was finished, the lake had only about seven to eight feet of water left. On the maiden voyage, Charlie quickly crossed the lake and circled around to return to the camp. Before he reached shore, the boat hit a mud bank and became hopelessly mired.

Adobe Charlie's boat never floated again. In fact, ruins of the craft deteriorated away on the dry alkali bed that was once Winnemucca Lake. The lake had begun a steady process of drying up after Derby Dam was constructed on the Truckee River in 1907. By 1939, the wonderful fishery had dried up to the point it became a desert once more.

In 1959, I was on a hunting trip to the Black Rock Desert area. When we passed Winnemucca Lake, I noticed something out-of-place out on the dry lakebed. I asked Tom Bradshaw, one of my fellow hunters, what the big black spot was out on the white sand. Tom told me it was a boat that had been there since the

Prohibition days. The following year, my girlfriend and I went back with camera in hand and walked out to see and photograph the wreck of Adobe Charlie's dream boat. Every year, thousands of people travel the road to Gerlach past the dried-up wreckage of Adobe Charlie's boat on their way to Burning Man without even knowing the desert they are traveling through was a lake full of fish a hundred years earlier.

I have included with this article one of the photos I took of the boat in 1959. Today there is not much left of the boat – just a few scattered timbers, planks and ribs. Both the fishing camp and the boat remains have been recorded as historical sites with the Nevada State Museum. I wish to thank Oyvind Frock for much of the historical information he provided to me about the boat and Adobe Charlie's fishing camp.
